

John 2:1-12
Wedding, Water, Wine, Glory, Belief

John 2:1-2 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. 2 Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding.

vs 1 - Wedding: the joining together of a husband and wife.

Rev. 19:9 Then he said to me, "Write: 'Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the Lamb!'"

John 2:3 And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine."

vs 3 - Wine = Wine / Fermented juice

Prov 20:1 Wine is a mocker, Strong drink is a brawler, And whoever is led astray by it is not wise.

Prov 21:17 He who loves pleasure will be a poor man; He who loves wine and oil will not be rich.

Prov 21:29 Who has woe? Who has sorrow? Who has contentions?
Who has complaints? Who has wounds without cause?
Who has redness of eyes?

30 Those who linger long at the wine,
Those who go in search of mixed wine.

Ephes 5:18 And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit

1 Cor 6:10 nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God.

1 Thess 5: 7 For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk are drunk at night. 8 But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation.

Eph. 5:17 Therefore do not be unwise, but understand what the will of the Lord is. 18 And do not be drunk with wine, in which is dissipation; but be filled with the Spirit,

Galations 5:19 Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, 20 idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, 21 envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like; of which I tell you beforehand, just as I also told you in time past, that those who practice such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

John 1:4 Jesus said to her, “Woman, what does your concern have to do with Me? My hour has not yet come.”

HIS HOUR - was the Cross

John 7:30 Therefore they sought to take Him; but no one laid a hand on Him, because His hour had not yet come.

John 12:23 But Jesus answered them, saying, “The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified.

John 13:1 Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that His hour had come that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.

John 17:1 Jesus spoke these words, lifted up His eyes to heaven, and said: “Father, the hour has come. Glorify Your Son, that Your Son also may glorify You,

THE HOUR - What the cross accomplished

John 4:23 But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him.

John 5:25 Most assuredly, I say to you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God; and those who hear will live.

John 5:28 Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice

John 2:5 His mother said to the servants, “Whatever He says to you, do it.”

AM - Super good advice for us today.

John 2:6 Now there were set there six waterpots of stone, according to the manner of purification of the Jews, containing twenty or thirty gallons apiece.

John 2:7 Jesus said to them, “Fill the waterpots with water.” And they filled them up to the brim.

AM Filled to the brim! no half heartedness in that.

8 And He said to them, “Draw some out now, and take it to the master of the feast.” And they took it.

**9 When the master of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and did not know where it came from (but the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom.
10 And he said to him, “Every man at the beginning sets out the good wine, and when the guests have well drunk, then the inferior. You have kept the good wine until now!”**

11 This beginning of signs Jesus did in Cana of Galilee, and manifested His glory; and His disciples believed in Him.

vs 11 - signs - Of signs, wonders, miracles wrought by Jesus and His Apostles and the prophets in proof and furtherance of their divine mission

vs 11 - Manifested - to make manifest or visible or known what has been hidden or unknown,

vs 11 - believed - To think to be true / to be persuaded

AM - this was the purpose of the sign. So they would believe. They still did not have a total understanding or complete faith but they believed.

12 After this He went down to Capernaum, He, His mother, His brothers, and His disciples; and they did not stay there many days.
